
★ The Water Availability Division is comprised of the following programs:

Drought: TCEQ Response Activities



- ★ Consults with public water systems regarding implementation of drought plans and specific needs as they arise
- Tracks public drinking water systems under water use restrictions—both voluntary and mandatory



TCEQ Response Activities (cont.)



★ Tracks and manages water rights and streamflow

★ Trains TCEQ region staff in non-watermaster areas to measure and monitor surface water flows to ensure that senior water right calls are honored and respected by protecting the flow of water

TCEQ Response Activities (cont.)

- ★ Operates drought information hotline during business hours to answer questions from the public: 800-447-2827
- ★ Maintains drought information web page
- ★ Provides news releases in areas where water rights have been curtailed
- ★ Holds weekly drought coordination meetings to monitor status and forecasts
- Actively participates with other state agencies on Joint Information Council and Drought Preparedness Taskforce
