-Keechi salt dome. Gully heading north in south side (Anderson County) of the dome a quarter of a mile east of the road. This massive, poorly bedded clay containing a little silt and a few calcareous, roughsurfaced, finely veined concretions washes down to a small residue of angular quartz particles and a few glauconite grains that are loosely cemented into irregular lumps. Foraminifera are abundant, and the assemblage, which is mainly that of the upper faunule, suggests the transition beds between the two zones.
